

## Invited Speakers Information Sheet

Seminars run from 14:10 to 15:30. However, the presentation time should not be more than 40 minutes, as we encourage interruption and discussion during the presentations. One slide takes about one minute to present, so more than 40 slides is too many. The audience is a mixture of clinicians, imaging scientists, epidemiologists and statisticians, so make explanations as simple as possible (but not simpler).

### LOCATION

The meetings are held in the Division of Clinical Neurosciences Seminar room, at the Western General Hospital, tucked away at the southern end of the DCN x-ray corridor, which can be accessed on the same level via the DCN main inpatient entrance, or via the floor below at the DCN outpatient entrance.

### INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

The seminar room is equipped with a University of Edinburgh PC loaded with Office 2007 with USB port. There is also an NHS PC available. The ceiling mounted data projector can also be used to present DVDs, VHS tapes, or to project from your own laptop. The sound is delivered from a pair of large wall mounted stereo speakers (though warn us if you want to use sound). There is also Tandberg Video conferencing equipment available.
